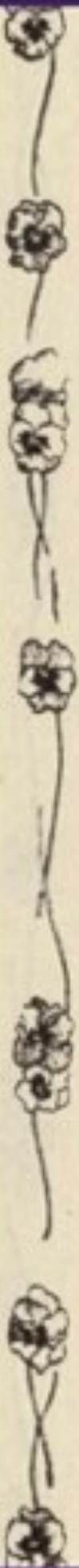


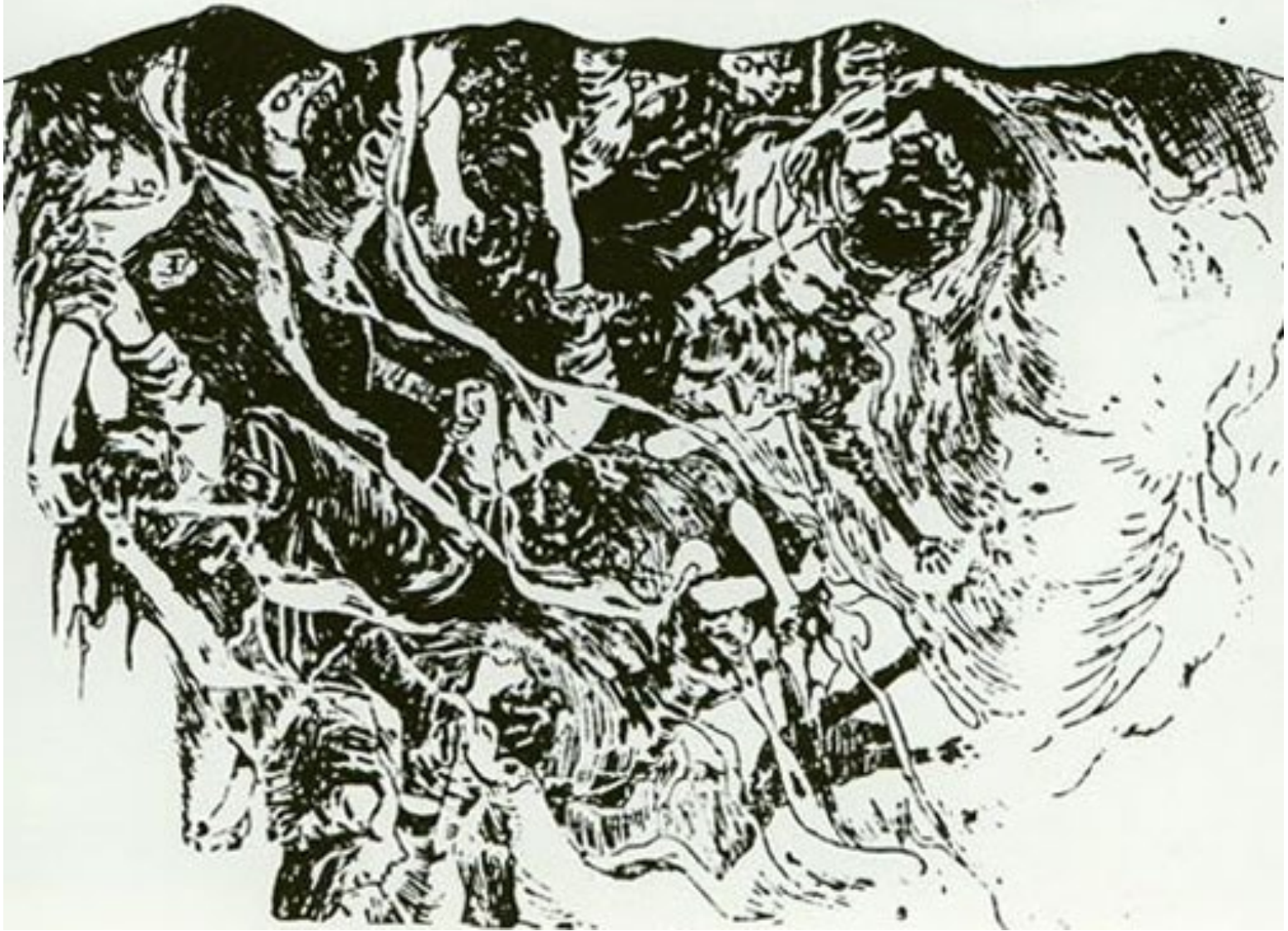

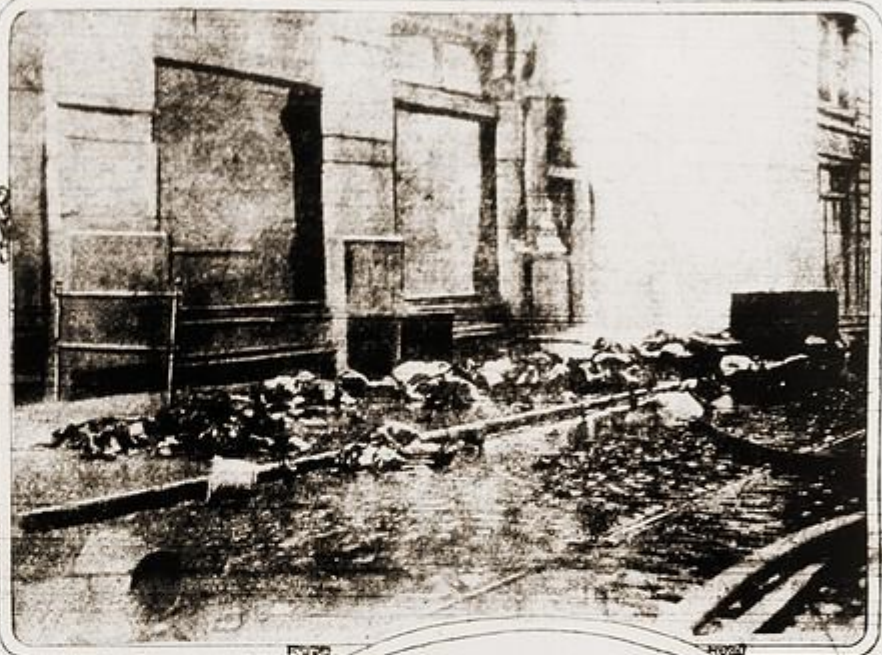

# 154 KILLED IN SKYSCRAPER FACTORY FIRE; SCORES BURN, OTHERS LEAP TO DEATH.

GREEN STREET STREETWAY WITH BODIES

## 700 WORKERS, MOSTLY GIRLS, TRAPPED; BODIES OF DEAD HEAP THE STREETS; ONLY ONE FIRE ESCAPE FOR ALL.

Employees Caught on Eighth, Ninth and Tenth Floors—The Blaze Spreads with Great Rapidity—Victims Jump from Window Ledges, with Clothing Aflame and Pile Up Below, Dead and Dying—Life Nets Either Torn from Grasp of Rescuers or Burst by Force of Numbers—Criminal Negligence May Be Charged for Locked Fireproof Doors Leading to Stairs—Blaze Is in Triangle Waist Co. Rooms, Washington Place and Greene St.

At 4:35 a clock yesterday afternoon fire springing from a source that may never be positively identified, was discovered in the rear of the eighth floor of the ten-story building at the northwest corner of Washington place and Greene street, the east of which floors occupied as a factory of the Triangle Waist Co. ... At 11:30 o'clock Chief Croker made this statement: "Every body has been removed. The number taken out, which includes those who jumped from the windows, is 141. The number of those that have died so far in the hospitals is seven, which makes the total number of deaths at this time 148."

the dreadful toll may be traced. Two other elevators were there, but were not in operation. The property damage resulting from the fire did not exceed \$100,000. To accommodate the unprecedented number of bodies, the Charities pier at the foot of East Twenty-ninth street was opened, for the first time since the Spanish disaster, with which this will rank, for no fire in a building in New York ever claimed so many lives before. Inspection by Acting Superintendent of Buildings Ludwig will be made the basis for charges of criminal negligence on the ground that the fire-proof doors leading to one of the inclosed tower stairways were locked. first signs that persons in the street knew that these three big stories had turned into red ferrets. They jumped with their clothing aflame. The help of some of the girls stretched out of doors as they leaped. That after that cascaded on the main streets. Heroic Elevator Boys Saved Hundreds. The elevator boys saved hundreds. They each made twenty trips from the top of the alarm with twenty minutes later when they could do no more. Five men were killed for their efforts, flames being in the cables. They had the same area fire.

Skeletons Breathing Over the Machines. While the huge building does it was as if it had died. There seemed no sound except the sound of the fire. When Chief Croker could make his way into these three floors he found signs that clearly stamped him—that was him, a man used to receive burials, back and down into the street with a gasping hiss.
